# Milwaukee Couple Killed in Accident Near Angelica



The auto of a Milwaukee couple was smashed like this early Monday morning when it hit a culvert near Angelica. The accident occurred in this morning's fog as the car was going north.

Killed in the accident were Gordon Barbaras and his wife, Mary.

## Car Crashes Culvert, Brings County Death Toll to Ten

Shawano county's 1951 traffic death toll rose to 10 today as a Milwaukee couple was killed three miles south of Angelica on county trunk C. The accident occurred between 5 and 6 a. m.

**KILLED** when their car struck a concrete culvert were Gordon F. Barbaras, 28, and his wife, Mary. They were going north when their 1950 Studebaker hit the culvert. Both were killed almost outright.

Mr. Barbaras, the driver, died of head injuries and Mrs. Barbaras, who was tossed from the car, died of a possible broken neck and other injuries.

Traffic Officer Ed Bahr reported that the accident occurred in this morning's heavy fog. Visibility was poor.

**COUNTY TRUNK C** is now a detour of highway 47 running from Angelica to Seymour.

Bahr said their auto was a total loss. The Barbaras lived at 2480 West Medford Avenue, Milwaukee.

There will be no inquest into the deaths, according to Coroner Harvey Stubenvoll.

The bodies were taken to Pulaski by the Marnocha Funeral Home and are to be taken to Milwaukee.
