the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said Deceased, which have or shall come to the
Hands, Possession or Knowledge of him the said Joseph Kidd

Administrator as aforesaid, or unto the Hands and Possession of any other Person
or Persons for him and the same so made do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited,
into the Register's Office, in the County of Northampton, at or before the first
Day of August next ensuing; and the same Goods, Chattels and Credits, and
all other the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said Deceased, at the time of his
Death, which at any Time after shall come to the hands or Possession of the said

Joseph Kidd Administrator as aforesaid, or unto the Hands
and Possession of any other Person or Persons for him do well and truly
administer according to Law. And further do make, or cause to be made, a true and
just Account of his said Administration, at or before the twenty sixth
